2 On the day of Pentecost all the believers were meeting together in one place.

² Suddenly, there was a sound from heaven like the roaring of a mighty windstorm, and it filled the house where they were sitting.

³Then, what looked like flames or tongues of fire appeared and settled on each of them.

⁴ And everyone present was filled with the Holy Spirit and began speaking in other languages, as the Holy Spirit gave them this ability.

⁵ At that time there were devout Jews from every nation living in Jerusalem.

⁶ When they heard the loud noise, everyone came running, and they were bewildered to hear their own languages being spoken by the believers.

⁷ They were completely amazed. "How can this be?" they exclaimed. "These people are all from Galilee, ⁸ and yet we hear them speaking in our own native languages!

⁹ Here we are—Parthians, Medes,

Elamites, people from Mesopotamia, Judea, Cappadocia, Pontus, the province of Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia, Pamphylia, Egypt, and the areas of Libya around Cyrene, visitors from Rome¹¹ (both Jews and converts to Judaism), Cretans, and Arabs. And we all hear these people speaking in our own languages about the wonderful things God has done!"

¹² They stood there amazed and perplexed. "What can this mean?" they asked each other.

¹³ But others in the crowd ridiculed them, saying, "They're just drunk, that's all!"

¹⁴ Then Peter stepped forward with the eleven other apostles and shouted to the crowd, "Listen carefully, all of you, fellow Jews and residents of Jerusalem! Make no mistake about this. ¹⁵ These people are not drunk, as some of you are assuming. Nine o'clock in the morning is much too early for that. ¹⁶ No, what you see was predicted long ago by the prophet Joel: ¹⁷ 'In the last days,' God says,

'I will pour out my Spirit upon all people.

Your sons and daughters will prophesy.

Your young men will see visions, and your old men will dream dreams.

- 18 In those days I will pour out my Spirit even on my servants-men and women alike-
- and they will prophesy.
- ¹⁹ And I will cause wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth belowblood and fire and clouds of smoke.
- ²⁰ The sun will become dark, and the moon will turn blood red before that great and glorious day of the LORD arrives.
- 21 But everyone who calls on the name of the LORD will be saved.'

This Sunday we come again today to the surprise and joy of Pentecost, which brings us to the conclusion of the season of Easter with a burst of excitement, celebrating what has been called the "birthday of the church"; However, it could be argued that the church's birth day was the day God chose a people to "bless the nation"; through the descendants of Abraham and Sarah. Both in Matthew's Gospel and Pauls letter to the Romans, the Mediterranean church has its origins in the promise made to Abraham and Sarah.

That said it is Peter's sermon as we have it recorded in the book of Acts Chapter 2 which gives birth to the rapid spread of Christianity from Jerusalem to the ends of the earth and forms the basis of our traditional celebrations on Pentecost Sunday.

What I like most about the celebration of Pentecost is that the commercial world has not yet got a hold of Pentecost. Unlike Christmas Easter and Halloween, there are no chocolate flames and cute fluffy doves for sale in the shops.


For those of us in the Uniting Church the day of Pentecost has served to remind us that the Gospel can be proclaimed in many languages, and it is an occasion for us to celebrate our cultural and linguistic diversity. And I pray that we might grow our relationships with the 500 PALM workers from nine Pacific Islands that are currently living in Tamworth.

This month I have baptised several adults and children, I am mindful that the Spirit is the gift that keeps on giving from the moment we are named and claimed in baptism until we die to this world and rise to eternal life. I also wonder when we say the Apostles Creed, do we really believe in the Holy Spirit.

Do we believe that Holy Spirit is at work doing a new thing, re-forming us as church, reigniting a passion and fire for the gospel, and giving us a new language that speaks to this age, our time, and our contexts. Are we willing to let go of the dry bones and dusty glory of some former decade to embrace new dreams and visions. I acknowledge that this is disconcerting, especially for those among us who don't do change well. But remember, we do not do this alone. Jesus has sent the Advocate, and this Holy Spirit will guide us always into the truth. This is our promise.

So, come Holy Spirit, come and renew your Church.

¹² "There is so much more I want to tell you, but you can't bear it now.


¹³ When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all truth. He will not speak on his own but will tell you what he has heard. He will tell you about the future.

Values are transmitted from generation to generation. What values do we teach our children through our example? How can we use our strengths to lift up those around us?


Let us not teach our kids the wrong ways and means to WIN.
