Jesus and the Prince of Demons

²⁰ One time Jesus entered a house, and the crowds began to gather again. Soon he and his disciples couldn't even find time to eat.

²¹ When his family heard what was happening, they tried to take him away. "He's out of his mind," they said.

²² But the teachers of religious law who had arrived from Jerusalem said, "He's possessed by Satan, the prince of demons. That's where he gets the power to cast out demons."

²³ Jesus called them over and responded with an illustration. "How can Satan cast out Satan?" he asked.

²⁴ "A kingdom divided by civil war will collapse. ²⁵ Similarly, a family splintered by feuding will fall apart.

²⁶ And if Satan is divided and fights against himself, how can he stand? He would never survive.

²⁷ Let me illustrate this further. Who is powerful enough to enter the house of a strong man and plunder his goods? Only someone even stronger-someone who could tie him up and then plunder his house.

²⁸ "I tell you the truth, all sin and blasphemy can be forgiven, ²⁹ but anyone who blasphemes the Holy Spirit will never be forgiven. This is a sin with eternal consequences."

³⁰ He told them this because they were saying, "He's possessed by an evil spirit."

³¹ Then Jesus' mother and brothers came to see him. They stood outside and sent word for him to come out and talk with them.

³² There was a crowd sitting around Jesus, and someone said, "Your mother and your brothers are outside asking for you."

³³ Jesus replied, "Who is my mother? Who are my brothers?"

³⁴ Then he looked at those around him and said, "Look, these are my mother and brothers.

³⁵ Anyone who does God's will is my brother and sister and mother."

¹³ But we continue to preach because we have the same kind of faith the psalmist had when he said, "I believed in God, so I spoke."

¹⁶ That is why we never give up. Though our bodies are dying, our spirits are being renewed every day.

¹⁷ For our present troubles are small and won't last very long. Yet they produce for us a glory that vastly outweighs them and will last forever!

¹⁸ So we don't look at the troubles we can see now; rather, we fix our gaze on things that cannot be seen. For the things we see now will soon be gone, but the things we cannot see will last forever.

In 2 Corinthians 4:16 Paul writes "So we do not lose Even though our outer nature is wasting away our inner nature is being renewed."

Paul is say that the clue to "not losing heart" cannot be found in what was. We are not likely to get back what we sometimes think of as "the glory days" of the church. And yet, could it be that God has something even greater in store?

Peel Valley Church Council met on 28 May and approved the redevelopment of 79 Denison Street, West Tamworth by the tenant, Primrosin Pty Ltd, including extension and new shed at the rear of West Tamworth Church Property as per Quote Q1205 from David Read Homes. This \$400,000 project funded by a Commonwealth grant will provide an extra 20 pre-school places for families in Tamworth.

The Executive, in reviewing the Singing Group resolved to move it from Hallsville to West Tamworth and to meet fortnightly on Monday mornings from 24 June. This new format will better facilitate the inclusion of folk living with dementia.

Wednesday was a big day in the life of Peel Valley. Reverend Chris Wright presided at the Funeral Service for one of the great saints of the West Tamworth community Heather Budden. At the same time, we hosted the Ministers Fraternal at Hallsville. Margaret Crowell did a marvellous job of being in two places at the one time. She was at Hallsville, to welcome our guests from the Liberty, C3, The Chapel, Presbyterian Churches and Scripture Union before she left to attend the s funeral.

At the meeting I learnt why the cross at the lookout is currently not lit at night. It's not that no one has paid the electricity account as the cross is considered to be one of the City Councils streetlights, but rather a matter of fluctuating voltage which keeps blowing the lights.

On 23 June the Joint Nominations Committee will be making a presentation to all three Congregations in regard to the placement of second Minister for the Tamworth Regional Uniting Churches. In parallel the Southside Church Council has inspected a modern family home in Calala that is potentially suitable for use as a Church Manse.

"My flower looks better




and healthier than yours. How is that even possible when your water is cleaner?" The father smiled, then said.



Puzzle is based on Mark 3:20-35




