John 3:1-17 (NLT)

- **3** There was a man named Nicodemus, a Jewish religious leader who was a Pharisee.
- ² After dark one evening, he came to speak with Jesus. "Rabbi," he said, "we all know that God has sent you to teach us. Your miraculous signs are evidence that God is with you."
- ³ Jesus replied, "I tell you the truth, unless you are born again, you cannot see the Kingdom of God."
- ⁴ "What do you mean?" exclaimed Nicodemus. "How can an old man go back into his mother's womb and be born again?"
- ⁵ Jesus replied, "I assure you, no one can enter the Kingdom of God without being born of water and the Spirit.
- ⁶ Humans can reproduce only human life, but the Holy Spirit gives birth to spiritual life
- ⁷ So don't be surprised when I say, 'You must be born again.'
- ⁸ The wind blows wherever it wants. Just as you can hear the wind but can't tell where it comes from or where it is going, so you can't explain how people are born of the Spirit."
- ⁹ "How are these things possible?" Nicodemus asked.
- ¹⁰ Jesus replied, "You are a respected Jewish teacher, and yet you don't understand these things?
- ¹¹ I assure you, we tell you what we know and have seen, and yet you won't believe our testimony.

Words from Rev Geoff All things are Possible

This week, we leave our Year B progress through the Gospel of Mark and read from the Gospel of John for a five-week reflection on the bread of life. Shifting Gospels requires us to shift from one literary world to another, from one narrative with its assumptions, purposes, and strategies to another with a different set of assumptions, purposes, and strategies. Similarly, as we prepare to welcome the Reverend Samuela (Sam) and Mary Sadrata as the newest members of our ministry team, we will need to rethink our assumptions, roles and strategies for mission in our Congregation. Sam bringing youth and vibrancy and a connection point with new areas within our community. As a church this is a time of change and a God given opportunity to grow our Congregations younger, to be missionally focused beyond the congregations, relationship building and steering a course towards the future.

Reading John 6:1-21 in isolation, we miss the grand themes of the Gospel of John, and we might wonder why he puts this story (which is told in all four Gospels, but not always exactly the same way) where it is. We might also be left wondering why these two stories, the feeding of the multitude and Jesus walking on water, are connected in today's reading. What do they have to do with each other? Yes, there is compassion and communion in these stories, but there is so much more. While Jesus' heart is touched by the hunger of the crowd, John is teaching us about the power of God in Jesus, about who Jesus is. And so we have the disciples overwhelmed by the crowd and calculating the cost of feeding so many people. "Impossible!" they say, but we know that all things are possible with God, so in John's account of the feeding of people is just as much. if not more, about the power of God in Jesus as it is about Jesus' compassion for the hungry crowd. God's power

is "far more than all we can ask or imagine"; as we read in Ephesians 3:20b.


